Following the pattern of previous years, Café Intent, and the Resource Centre will be open after Bible Readings and Evening Celebrations.

## OVERVIEW

### Evening Celebration and Bible Readings

The Evening Celebration takes place each evening, Saturday through to Friday, commencing at 1930 and finishing at approximately 2115. The style of the programme is inspirational and celebratory and consists of worship, Bible teaching, interviews and profiles of mission across the world. The Bible Readings take place each morning, Monday to Friday, commencing at 1000 and finishing at 1100. The focus of the Bible Readings is very much Bible teaching. Both these events are held in a 3,000 seater marquee on the edge of the University campus.

### Children and Youth Programme

The youth programme is offered for the benefit of children whose parents are on campus attending a Bible Reading, Seminar or Evening Celebration. New Horizon has always seen working with young people as a vital and rewarding part of the week. Different programmes are geared to appropriate ages and cover from Crèche through to 18 years of age. Training is undertaken by everyone supervising or with involvement in any part of the Youth Programme and all such are Access NI checked. Prior registration for these activities is essential, although some spaces may be available during the course of the week. There is a registration charge for these activities.

Online registration will be available from Monday 7 April.

### NH Explore

Monday to Friday 11.45 to 12.45. The seminar programme has been renamed ‘NH Explore’ to reflect its purpose and style: exploring specific issues in depth through a range of approaches including seminars, workshops, discussion groups, panels, presentations and talks. The aim is to challenge our minds and hearts, equip us to serve God in all of life and connect us with one another for His glory.

### Prayer and Pastoral Support

We have an experienced Pastoral Support Team during the week of New Horizon who will be prepared to spend time with you in prayer for whatever is on your heart – whether it is an issue which is burdening you or something you feel the Lord is saying to you at New Horizon. Anything you share will be treated in confidence. Should you need extra help with something, then our team will be happy to find you a professional counsellor – appointments are available during the week of New Horizon as well as after the Event.

### Volunteers

New Horizon relies on nearly 400 volunteers each year to ensure the event runs smoothly. If you would like to join one of our teams and are aged 18 or over contact us through the website. There is a range of opportunities from helping prepare the site, stewarding, general support, youth and children’s work, prayer and pastoral support.

### Mission

Mission is an integral part of New Horizon. Each year we have an extensive Mission Resources Area which is brought together by over 30 organisations, presenting the opportunities and needs of mission. Through the generosity of those who have attended the event over the years, New Horizon has been able to support financially many mission projects, both globally and locally.

### Cost

There is no charge for attending the events in the main pavilion or the daily seminar programme. New Horizon is supported by the generosity of freewill offerings from those who attend the event.

### Parking

Parking is available on campus and charges will apply between the following timeframes:

Monday to Thursday: 0700 – 1900  
Friday: 0700 – 1700

All other periods will be free of charge. Payment can be made by presenting a credit card at the barrier on entry and again on exit and the system will calculate the tariff due and deduct it from the credit card account. Alternatively payment can be made at pay stations on campus before exiting.

### Disabled Car Parks

The car park next to the New Horizon Pavilion is available for Disabled Badge Holders at £2 per car per morning. There is no evening charge. To gain access to the Disabled Car Park, you must register with New Horizon and display both the New Horizon Pass and your Blue Disabled Badge.
