1. Reviving hope (v4)

Back to the time of the return from Exile

Optimism in the face of disappointment, then and now

- rebuild
- restore
- renew

God's concern for people and places (cities)



2. Receiving strangers (v5)

God's vision for the nations.

National exclusivity is shattered

- The blessing of immigration
- The emergence of the global church – shift in the centre of gravity
- A glorious vision, no room for gloom



3. Releasing gifting (v6)

The priesthood of all believers –

Exodus 19:6, 1 Peter 2:9,

Revelation 1:5-6

A place for ordained ministry, but the need to recognise and use the gifts of all.



4. Removing shame (v8)

Israel's legacy of shame

Shame = a painful feeling of humiliation or distress caused by the consciousness of my own wrong or foolish behaviour or what has been done to me.

Healing = forgiveness + acceptance Healing = recognition + justice



5. Rewarding faith (v8-9)

The nature of God – He loves justice (Isaiah 58:6-7)

Directed to the faithful remnant – the reward of faith (trust) – Hebrews 11:6, 6:10 and Isaiah 8:12, 26:3-4
